

An International webinar on "Understanding Shakespeare in Today's Context: Macbeth in Special Focus "was organized by the Department of English, Vyasa Nagar Autonomous College, Jajpur Road, Odisha, a premier non-government aided educational institution with national and international acclaim and catering to the needs of higher learning of thousands of students from different corners of the state and country on Sunday, the 5th September, 2021 on the auspicious Teacher's Day for more than three hours from 6 pm to 9.30 pm under the chairmanship of Dr. Kusha Chandra Pradhan, the Principal I/C and the Head of the Department of English of the college.



Prof. Tushar Raman Oza, Oakland University, Rochester, Michigan, USA, delivered the key note address and an illuminating speech on the topic. he told on Macbeth's duality in character bringing out the good and evil in man, structure, metrical composition of most of lines of dialogues, its loose ends, and particularly comparison of the play with Lord Krishna 's advice to Arjun and the character of Lady Macbeth with that of Draupadi in terms of the imagery of bloodshed and war.

In the interactive session the participation of the participants and lively discussions on the questions raised by the participants was very edifying and also interesting, particularly the concursions made by Dr. Payal Trivedi from Gujurat, Mrs Somali Gupta from Barkhanda and Sri Debasis Patra from Balasore, Odisha added glamour and a new taste to the programme. It was really a very memorable and remarkable event in the academic history of the Department of English and also the college. It is hoped that this webinar would be highly beneficial for students and also refreshing and illuminating for the teachers and other participants of the webinar.
